David Brown obtained his undergraduate degree in chemistry from San Diego State University in 1973 and a master's of public health degree from the University of California at Berkeley in 1975.

He began his career as a Commissioned Officer in the U.S. Public Health Service (USPHS) in 1975 when he started working for the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH), Centers for Disease Control in Cincinnati, Ohio. At NIOSH he conducted numerous epidemiology studies involving workers exposed to various toxic agents, including PCBs, asbestos, silica, perchloroethylene, pesticides, enriched uranium, and vinyl chloride. He also assisted in the management, at the Branch and Division level, of many other studies and investigations bringing together multidisciplinary teams of epidemiologists, biostatisticians, industrial hygienists, and computer technologists.

In 1991, he continued his career in the USPHS at the National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences (NIEHS), National Institutes of Health, in Research Triangle Park, North Carolina. At NIEHS, he worked on prevention programs, served as a scientific review administrator and in the Director's office as his Chief of Staff.

In August, 2005, after 30 years of service, Mr. Brown retired from the USPHS and began work for the SRA/Constella Group, where he is currently the Director of Program Development for the Health Sciences Research Center and serves as the Administrator of the Research Triangle Environmental Health Collaborative.
